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JOINT CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

2015/16 was another year in which we made good headway towards fulfilling our aims though the long time that it takes to deliver on some matters can be exasperating!

As we write this review, we are now with a month of taking delivery of the Pavilion from our contractor, RJM Building Contractors. The planning of this project started in 2012 and has required huge amounts of time, effort and commitment from our Board, our Working Group members, our Architects, de Rosee Sa, and many others. All of us hope that this new facility will add to the experience of users of the green, particularly of the Playground and the tennis courts and that it will over time become a much valued focal point for Brook Green's community.

We are particularly pleased too that after a competition to select an operator for the Kiosk, we have been able to appoint The Corner House as our Licensee. Two of the partners in this new venture, Victoria Emmerson and Annabel Fitzwilliams are local residents, which give us great confidence that it will be operated in a way which is sympathetic to and respectful of the local community and environment.

The Friends again organised two principal social events in 2015/16, our Brook Green Day Fair in September and our inter-street Quiz night in January. Though these require a lot of volunteer effort, they appear genuinely to be widely enjoyed and serve our aim to foster the sense of community in our locality.

We are deeply grateful to our many regular volunteers from the Community and to our Estate Agent sponsors (Finlay Brewer, Bectives, Tates, Marsh & Parsons, Savills and KfH) and their staff, without all of whose help, these events would not be possible in their current form.

Our Events programme also serves an important economic function. By hosting them, we were able to generate a surplus of $\pounds 15,000$ which more than covered our annual operating costs, principally incurred on accountancy services, our website and our newsletter, of approximately $\pounds 3,000$.

We use our remaining financial surplus from these activities to augment other funds that we have succeeded in raising for the betterment of the Green by way of donation, grant award or Section 106 contribution.

October 2015 to March 2016 was the first winter when Brook Green tennis courts have had illumination (as a result of the installation of floodlighting as part of our upgrade of the courts completed in 2015). We are pleased to report that usage of the courts after dark and up to 8.30pm through the winter months amounted to some 560 hours. Little, if any, of this would have been possible previously.

Our AGM this year is at the Sacred Heard Church Hall, 41 Brook Green at 7pm on 6th December. As well as electing and reelecting Directors to the Board we intend to use the occasion to outline the Plans we have for the Western Lawn's makeover an initiative that will move into greater focus in 2017. We hope as many of you as can will make the effort to attend.

As always we would like to acknowledge with thanks the time and commitment made to the Friends by all members of our Board and by the many volunteers who have helped us in facing the challenges we take on.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Unsold stock is carried at no value. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
